- 3. What was the Articles of Confederation? Why was it abandoned?
- 4. How did the Bill of Rights come into being? What is the main purpose of the Bill of Rights?
- 5. What is the process known as incorporation? How did incorporation expand the scope of the Bill of Rights?
- 6. What is the principle known as "state action"? How does state action limit the scope of the Bill of Rights?
- Discuss in four or five sentences why, concerning rights of minorities and women, the First Amendment did not protect equality among the American people.
- 8. In your own words, discuss how you think the First Amendment can promote tolerance.
